Argued March 18, 2008-Decided June 26, 2008 District of Columbia law bans handgun possession by making it a crime to carry an unregistered firearm and prohibiting the registration of handguns; provides separately that no person may carry an unli censed handgun, but authorizes the police chief to issue 1-year li censes; and requires residents to keep lawfully owned firearms unloaded and disassembled or bound by a trigger lock or similar de vice. Respondent Heller, a D. C. special policeman, applied to regis ter a handgun he wished to keep at home, but the District refused. He filed this suit seeking, on Second Amendment grounds, to enjoin the city from enforcing the bar on handgun registration, the licensing requirement insofar as it prohibits carrying an unlicensed firearm inthe home, and the triggerlock requirement insofar as it prohibits the use of functional firearms in the home. The District Court dismissed the suit, but the D. C. Circuit reversed, holding that the Second Amendment...
